IN MY OPINION

It's been a Good Year

Ocean Penny Postage

We all know of the Penny Black, the First Official Postage Stamp issued by Great Britain in 1840. A the same time, there was the Mulready Cover issued which also was one penny.



That interested an American blacksmith, freedom activist, anti-slavery, with the nickname "the learned Blacksmith". Elihu Burnitt, from Connecticut, was heavily involved in the freedom movement, who in 1846 initiated an International Peace Congress in London England, Manchester and Frankfurt Germany.

In his work for delivering his peace message and articles, he made use of the Mulready letters sending the message to the corners of the world for the cheap postage of a penny. It was quite effective to get his message across.

His work was productive. In 1849 the "Ocean Penny Postage Covers" emerged. These covers had detailed engraving, with the 1865 Ocean Pen-



ny Cover depicting Britannia with representatives of nations of the world and ships in the background. That is how the peace movement influenced the Philatelic World.

Christmas Airmail over the Ocean

The first powered flight was done by the Wright brothers in 1908. They flew a few hundred feet. It was years before anyone flew an aircraft any long distance, not to mention over the open sea. Those first flights were always of interest to the postal services in improving the speed of letters,



and believe it or not collectors. Even then there was the start of first flight

covers.

In New Zealand, the start of Air Mail wasn't until 1928, but officially, it started in the fall of 1931. The flight in 1928 was an event to see if it could be done. Before 1931, Any letters leaving New Zealand for the rest of the world left by



sea. It wasn't until Charles pilot Kingsford Smith, from Australia, flew

over fourteen hours over the Tasmanian Sea to land in Christchurch to 30,000 onlookers. Due to bad weather, the return flight took 23 hours, leaving only drops of fuel in the tank when he landed. Air mail to Australia started in 1921 with the Christmas mail that connected to the Australian National Airways flight to London England.

The first New Zealand Airmail stamps came out for flight across the two islands in 1931. Regular postage was 2 pence with 3 pence surcharge for air, making 5 pence. For the official Christmas flight, connecting to the British Islands, the Postal printers

printed the regular 3 pence brown stamp in Green. This was overprinted with "Five Pence" in RED for this flight.

Since Charles Kingsford Smith was the aviation hero in Australia at the time, setting records and daring flights,





Stamps issued featured his name on them. He initiated an arduous route from Darwin to London, where several sections were over bodies of water, with many refueling stops.

Kingsford smith got the nickname "the Flying Mailman" after flying 1400 pounds of mail from England to Australia. He was still trying to break records when on November 8, 1935 he was lost at sea between India and Singapore.
